OK Corral is a new beardless variety that grazes longer in the spring and has an impeccable resistance to leaf rust, stripe rust, soil borne mosaic, and hessian fly. Combined with greater yield potential for grazing, grain or hay. OK Corral is highly recommended for its dual-purpose capabilities of grazing and grain or forage. Pasture establishment throughout the fall and winter season is excellent. OK Corral naturally canopies quicker than other wheat varieties all while surpassing a wide range of diseases. This beardless wheat variety flourishes in dryland conditions.
