Description



One of the most popular, TAM 112 produces consistent grain yields even after long periods of drought. TAM 112 is resistant to greenbug, wheat streak mosaic, and wheat curl mite. It has a strong dryland grain yield history. It covers the ground quickly under dry soil conditions. It is a high-tillering variety which recovers quickly in winter and early spring. It also keeps the tillers very well under late drought stress conditions. TAM 112 yields very high grain and forage and is known to be superior from central Texas to southern Nebraska.
