Description



Tam 204 is a medium maturity, shorter height, beardless hard red winter wheat with excellent growth for fall and winter grazing and silage with 80-100 bushel potential for grain yield. TAM 204 is for either irrigation or dryland acres. Fall and winter grazing surpass many other varieties. With resistance to soil borne mosaic, wheat streak mosaic, wheat curl mite, and stem rust you can expect consistency of production. This wheat has increased leaf to stem ratio providing better protein and digestibility for forage use.
